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



Solarvest (SOLAR MK)

Strengthening Its Regional Footprint; BUY

• Reiterate BUY, TP rises to MYR2.37 from MYR2.33, 35% upside. We are positive on Solarvest's major development in Brunei via its 34% stake in Seri Suria Power (B), which marks a strategic step in expanding its regional footprint. This venture strengthens the group's presence in the region, as well as enhances its recurring income base through the development and ownership of renewable energy (RE) assets. The project underscores Solarvest's commitment to becoming a leading clean energy and green technology solutions provider across key markets.



- Potential earnings contribution. Management guided that the project's IRR will be in line with its Malaysia-based projects, ie ranging from a high single digit to the low teens. Total capex is estimated at BND35m, with funding structured at a 70:30 debt-to-equity ratio. Based on these parameters and Solarvest's 34% stake, we estimate the project could contribute earnings of MYR2-3m pa. Excluding project financing, net gearing is estimated to rise to
- Forecasts. We raise our earnings estimates by 2%, 3%, and 3% for FY25-27 to reflect the higher share of profit contributions. Consequently, our SOPbased TP ticks up to MYR2.37, based on 30x P/E on FY26F fully diluted EPCC EPS, and DCF (WACC: 5.4%) on Large-Scale Solar 4 (LSS4) and Corporate Green Power Programme (CGPP) solar assets. It also includes an 8% ESG premium, due to its ESG score of 3.4 (vs the 3.0 country median).
- Downside risks: Slow replenishment of its orderbook, dependence on government policies and initiatives on RE, competition risks, and unexpected increases in project costs.

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Emissions And ESG

Trend analysis
In FY24, Solarvest's total GHG emissions totalled 1,256.88
tCO2e, reflecting an increase of 165% as the group started
disclosing its Scope 3 emissions. As such, in considering
only Scope 1 and 2 emissions, its total emissions have
increased from 474 tCO2e to 510 tCO2e – a spike of 7.5%,
in line with its business expansion and growth.

Latest ESG-Related Developments

As of FY23, the group has installed a total cumulative solar PV project capacity of c.432MWp that is operational. This could effectively displace CO2 levels by an estimated c.352,789 tonnes annually.

Solarvest also installed a 11kWac EV charging station at the basement carpark of its headquarters in Petaling Jaya, Selangor in 2022.


